Our morning assemblies are our time to start our day off right for kids. It allows students to get energy out during Brain Gym movements, as well as focus their brains on being ready to learn when they enter the classroom.

If you are present during that time, either in the gym or the hallways we need your help in creating the best environment for our assembly. Please help us in keeping voices off and in encouraging participation. When the adults are talking in the gym and hallways, our students are unsure of their expectations.

ATTENDANCE:

As stated in the Student/Parent Handbook

We believe it is important for students to attend school and learn to be punctual. We encourage prompt and regular attendance, as it is very important to your child's academic success. If your child must be tardy or absent from school:

- It is required for you to call or send a note to the school office stating the reason for the absence in order for the tardy or absence to be considered as excused. Without a reason for the excuse, notified absences will be marked as verified unexcused.
- ORS 339.065 requires us to excuse absences for reasons of sickness of the student or someone in the student's family, or for an emergency.
- For illnesses longer than 3 days in duration, we request a doctor's note.
- The law also allows for excused absences for other reasons providing it has been arranged in advance with the principal. In incidences where these requirements are not met, absences and tardies will be recorded as unexcused.
- After four unexcused absences, parents/guardians will be notified by phone and/or mail of being in violation of ORS.339.065.

Punctuality is important in getting the instructions for the day and having a good start for the day. Announcements will begin in the gym at 8:05am each day, with the late bell ringing at 8:15am. After that time, your child will be marked tardy.



From First Grade: We will hit over 2,000 PAX minutes before spring break. We are now up to three games a day for 30 minutes each time. After Spring Break we should be able to have 40 minute games they are doing so well - Mrs. VanHorn
